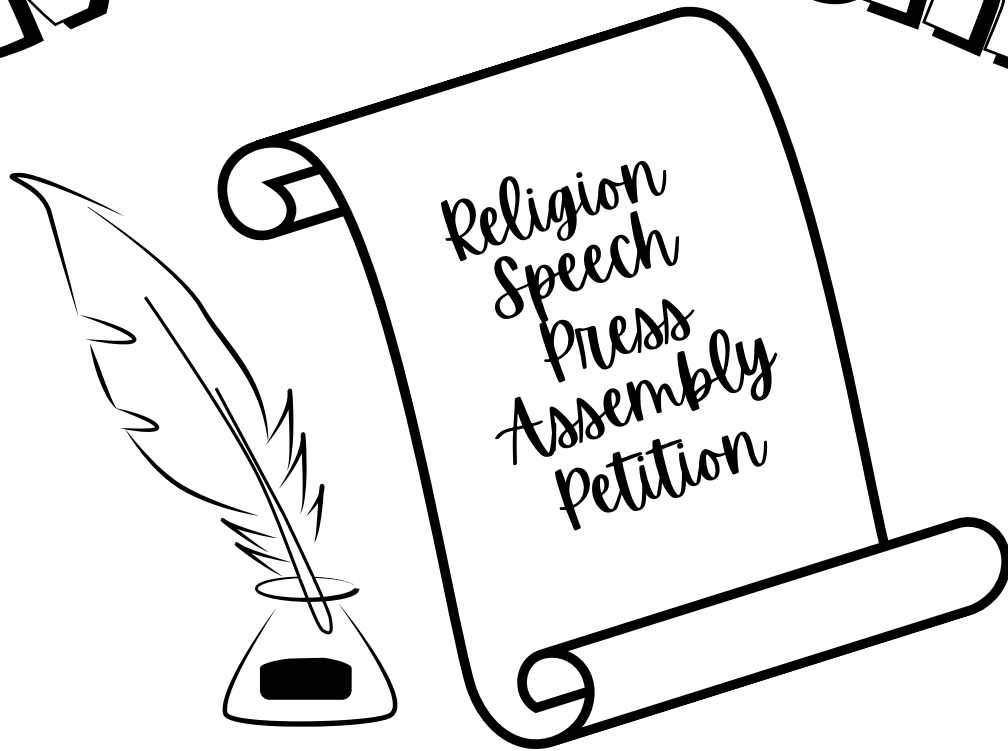

Religion

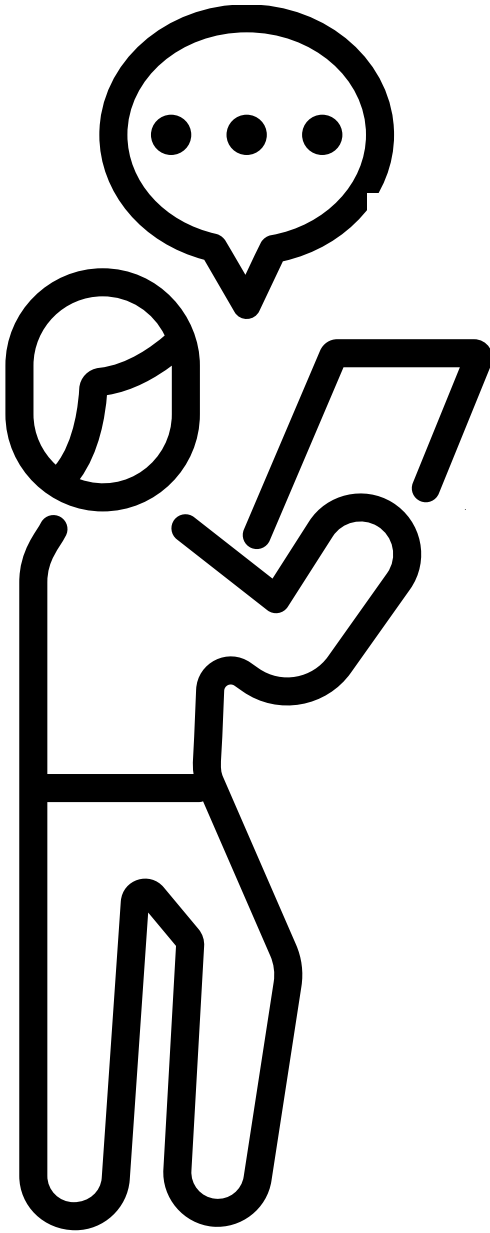


The freedom to pray or practice any religion you choose, or the freedom to not pray or practice a religion.

The freedom for reporters to investigate and write about the decisions and actions of government officials, and your freedom to read it.

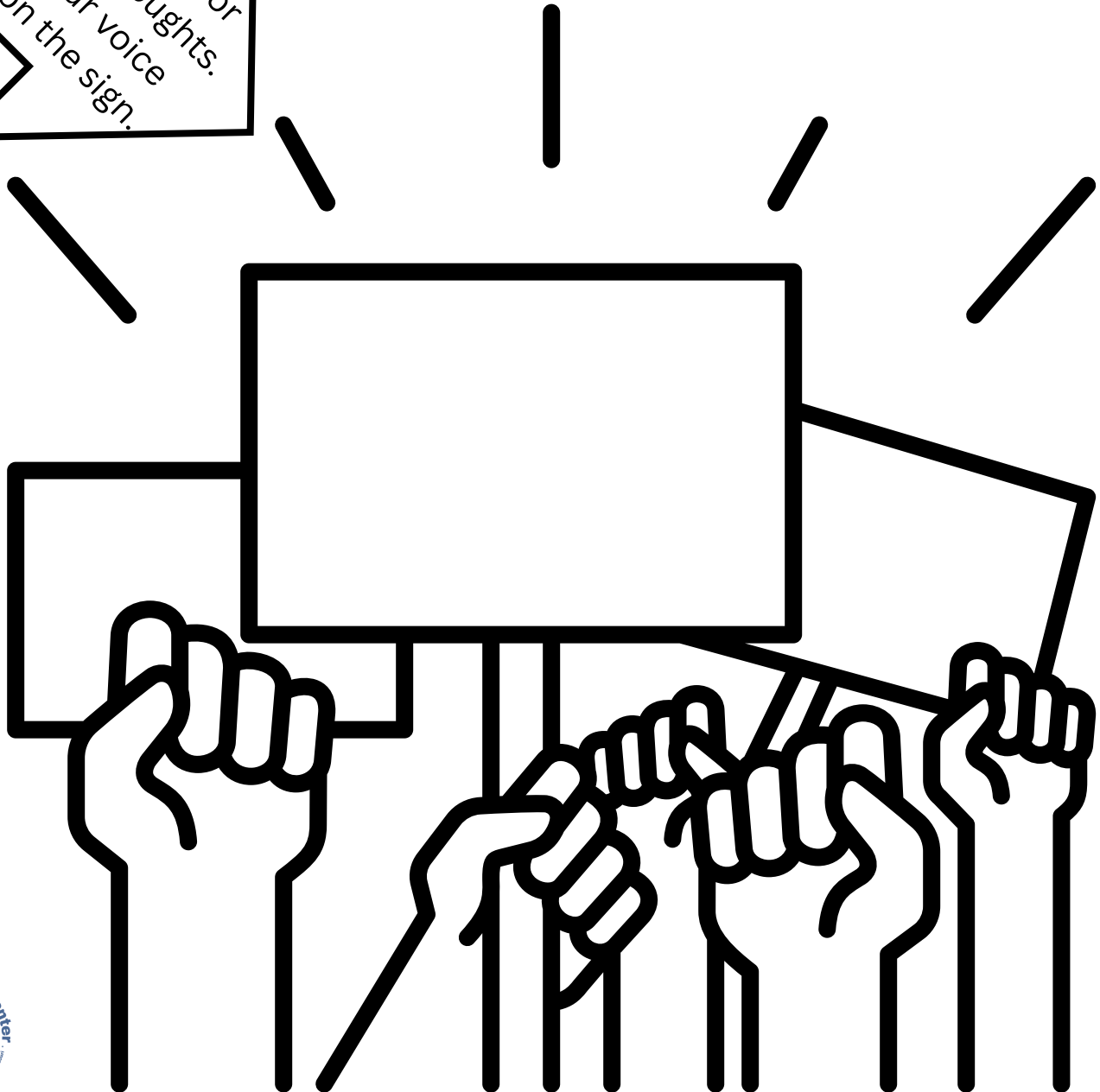
Select a news story that is interesting to you. Follow the story for a couple of days. Write a Letter to the Editor with your thoughts about the topic.

celebration.**

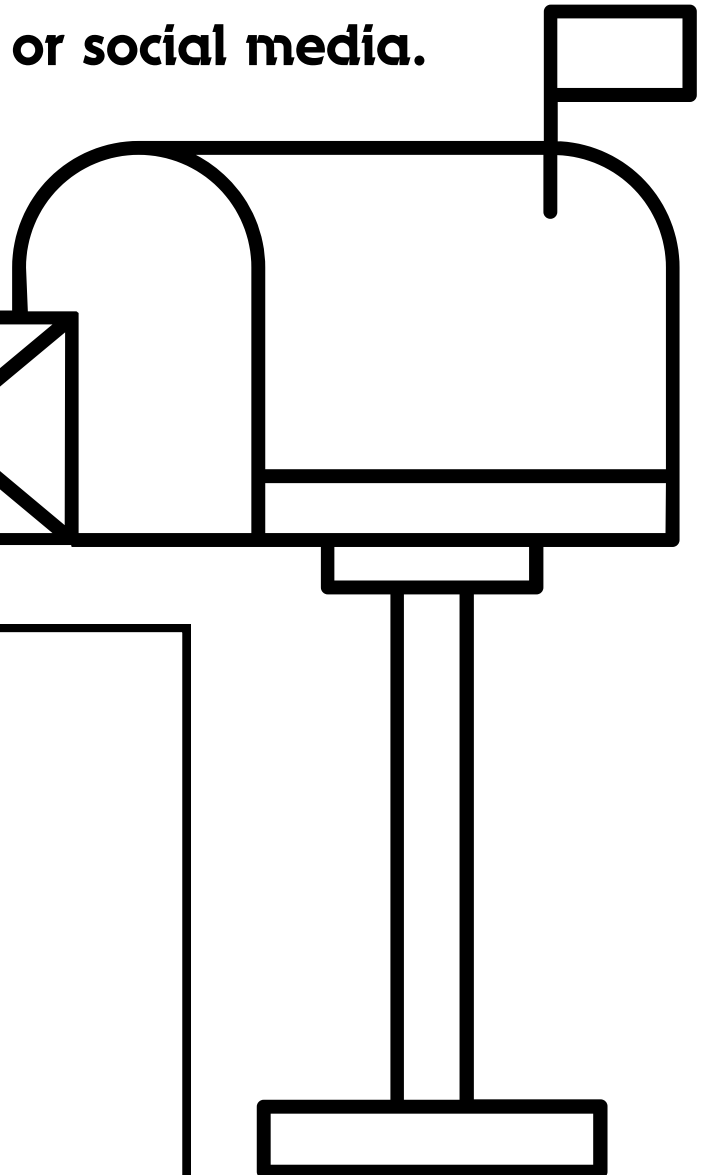
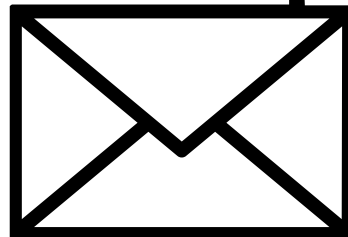
